Men, women, and children who fled civil war in their native country are now returning in a desperate bid to find elusive peace and dignity amidst this region's terrible turmoil.

It is overwhelming to think of the heartbreaking human toll this cycle of seemingly endless conflict claims. And yet, our faith in God shows us the light in this darkness. We see it in the stories featured in this newsletter:

Eyewitness to Tragedy Refugees Flee Across Border to Escape Sudan War

Since violent conflict erupted in April in and around Sudan's capital city, nearly 70,000 South Sudanese have returned to their home country, but this time as refugees.

Having fled poverty and violence in their homeland, they are once again uprooted by the region's raging unrest, creating a massive influx of frightened refugees into already desperately struggling areas. U.N. estimates predict the number of refugees could ultimately number in the hundreds of thousands, threatening to further destabilize the region.

Matt Smith, VP of Strategic Partnerships and Development at SRF, has been in the eve of this storm, traveling to Malakal, near the northern border between the two countries. There, he witnessed the unfolding crisis and the devastation that has resulted from it.

"Refugees are coming by the boatload," Smith reports. "Most have traveled five days or more with nothing but what they can carry. The boat can only transport so many at a time, and thousands more remain stranded at the border."

"Local leaders are doing what they can to provide for the refugees," he continued. "But Malakal itself has been decimated by war and flooding during the past two years. With a severe hunger crisis looming, the region is ill equipped to supply the massive needs of incoming refugees."

SRF has offered its support with funding to aid Bishop Stephen Nyodho in the dioceses' ongoing efforts to ferry refugees across the border. But delivering them to shelter from the violence in the north is only one small step in this perilous battle for survival.

Malakal – and the nation of South Sudan as a whole – is woefully unprepared to care for the surge of refugees, as its own resources are running dry. Fuel costs are astronomical, and food is scarce, with millions suffering food insecurity and at risk of starvation this year.

"When you are caught between two raging fires," Bishop Stephen recounted to Smith, "you have to go through the one that's a little less hot."

That's the decision facing thousands of people currently fleeing from Khartoum to South Sudan. We ask that you keep them in your prayers.

MOM Hospital Gets Critical Boost SRF Donors Fund \$300,000 in Key Supplies

The number of lives saved through the heroic efforts of Dr. Tom Catena and all those at Mother of Mercy (MOM) Hospital in Nuba is nearly incalculable.

It's not unusual for people to travel on foot for days, or drive for many hours over nearly impassable roads, to find help at Mother of Mercy Hospital. Because here, if anywhere, is the only place they might find hope and healing.

For over 15 years, Dr. Tom has tirelessly tended the sick as MOM hospital has slowly but steadily been upgraded through the generous support of SRF donors. From a facility that often had no electricity or running water, it now features important modern updates including a new operating theater and children's ward. Yet its remote location presents daunting challenges for delivering badly needed supplies..

SRF is deeply invested in Dr. Tom's vision of providing vital medical services and healing to the community and seeing that the hospital continues to thrive into the future. Your generous support has recently allowed us to provide over \$300,000 worth of essential medical supplies toward these efforts.

The timing of these gifts was a true blessing from God. Supplies have been delivered in advance of the rainy season in South Sudan, when roads become impassable and supply trucks get stuck in thick mud, unable to reach this region where Dr. Tom

is the only residing surgeon for a population of more than 1.3 million people.

But our efforts must continue. Dr. Tom has already provided his next "wish list" of equipment vital for upgrading the facility and providing more comprehensive care. These include an endoscope and a pediatric bronchoscope which can expand the treatments available to many, especially children.

With your support and God's blessing, we can continue to provide Dr. Tom with shipments to upgrade MOM Hospital, and positively impact the lives of countless South Sudanese in the years ahead.

The challenges of receiving healthcare in South Sudan can easily turn an emergency into a tragedy. Fortunately for young Rayan, when it mattered most, the care she needed was there – thanks in large part to generous donations by SRF supporters.

The eldest among her three siblings in Nuba, Rayan lives with epilepsy. In November, she suffered a seizure while watching her baby sister and fell, landing in a fire pit. Neighbors ran to help, but before they could pull her to safety, she had suffered terrible burns on much of her body.

Rayan required admission to Mother of Mercy (MOM) Hospital with a severe infection.

After several excruciating weeks of wound care, Rayan has found her smile again as her body heals from receiving the right care, at just the right time.
